

FIRST SCRIPTURE LESSON

Luke 10:38-42

Doug

Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village where a woman named Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at Jesus's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks, so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her, then, to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things, but few things are needed—indeed only one. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

Christ is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation, for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him, provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a minister of this gospel.

I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its minister according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.



This text, which has also been translated as "Fairest Lord Jesus" and "Beautiful Savior," was included in a German Catholic hymnot published in Minster. The melody, known by various names, is thought to be a Silesian folk tune.

WORSHIP NOTES



The **Rev. Dr. Toni Dunbar** is a native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and a long-time resident of the San Francisco Bay Area. She is a founding elder and pastor of education at City of Refuge United Church of Christ in Oakland, California.

Rev. Toni earned her Master of Divinity degree, and her Doctor of Ministry in Clergy & Community Education, from Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, California. She is an impassioned social advocate and educator, promoting the role of communities — especially faith communities—in the reclamation of society's most marginalized and highly at-risk members.

Her projects include Refuge Institute, offering practical leadership development for clergy and community; post-secondary instruction in progressive social ministry, and on several fronts, battles for justice and against stigma persons with mental health challenges and the urban poor.

She is also the principal of Imara Heritage LLC, a community education, grant writing and consulting entity with deep nonprofit roots. Imara Heritage's motto "And the people could fly" suggests it is possible to escape stigma and poverty, to gain freedom, independence and opportunity. Her sense is urgent and directed toward a future powered by progressive – even radical – theology and social engagement. "Clergy," Rev. Toni says, "are the conscience of community."

"Give Me Jesus" (also known as "And I Heard the Mourner Say") is a traditional American Christian spiritual song. Possibly the earliest known version of "Give Me Jesus" was published in the United States in 1845 by the Rev. Jacob Knapp, a Baptist minister from New York. By 1849 the Methodists published a version, and the song was popularized in the mid-nineteenth century through various camp meetings and hymnals. "Give Me Jesus" was popular among African American congregations, and Slave Songs of the United States (1867) mentions that former slaves in Port Royal, South Carolina, sang it, although the song may not have originated solely with slaves, as it was published previously by the Methodists. However, African American congregations likely influenced its modern form. In 1873 the Fisk Jubilee Singers published a version of the song that remains popular today. The transformation of this song into the theology and experience of enslaved Africans reveals that the focus migrated from millennial concerns for salvation and Jesus' thousand-year reign on earth to themes of deliverance from this earth, the reunion with family in heaven, and ultimate safety in the presence of Jesus.

Plans for Pastor Todd's Sabbatical

Pastor Todd's letter of call provides for a paid three-month sabbatical leave every five years. After postponing it for a year, he will be taking this leave very soon! His last Sunday before sabbatical will be **August 3rd**, returning November 3rd and back in worship on November 9th.

We are looking forward to granting this well-deserved leave to Pastor Todd, and plans to cover his duties have been underway over these past several months. No one has been working harder at covering all the needed duties than Pastor Todd himself!



In addition to performing the duties of her call with us, **Pastor Lauren** will be present during worship most of the Sundays Pastor Todd is away, preaching at least twice and shepherding three other services. We have also engaged several guest preachers, including two DCC members!

Through Pastor Todd, the Moderator Team met with and has engaged the **Rev. Carol Barriger** to provide additional worship and pastoral support and cover the following duties in Pastor Todd's absence:

- preach three Sundays;
- maintain office hours at the church office each Tuesday, working with John and Anne-Marie to plan the bulletin, music, and provide other worship support, and following up with members;
- provide pastoral care as needed.



Pastor Carol brings to DCC a wealth of church leadership and pastoral care experience. She is ordained in the UCC and has served numerous churches in our Conference (DCC will be her seventh); she has also as a hospital chaplain. She was an Associate Conference Minister of our Conference and later served as a member and chair of various sections of the Committee on Ministry, mentoring candidates for ministry and, currently, reviewing ethical concerns. Pastor Carol is a graduate of Harvard University, received the M.Div. from Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, and later an M.A. in Biblical Studies. She taught UCC history, theology and polity as

an adjunct faculty member at PSR, and in various other settings.

Pastor Carol is eager to get to know DCC folks and is grateful to Pastor Todd and the Moderator Team for opening the door to serving and learning among us. She is dedicated to the justice and equality taught to us by Jesus, and loves all sorts of music She will be with us in worship on August 3 and will stick around during Coffee Hour so you can get to know her.


