

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

A gifted Congregational minister in London, Thomas Toke Lynch was the subject of controversy within the churches upon the publication of his hymn collection, *The Rivulet*, which received poor reviews. This hymn was labeled Lynch's "best" when it appeared in *Congregational Praise* (1951).

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance, and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith, with Sarah's involvement, he received power of procreation, even though he was too old, because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better homeland, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is God's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

"Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during the middle of the night or near dawn and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

"But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect."

New Weekly Spotlight – Meet Our Deacons **This Week – Meet Dottie Howell**

DCC's deacons, aka the Diaconate, are appointed by the Church Council "to aid and advise the Minister(s) and the Council, to stand with and listen to persons in the congregation, and to provide special ministries of reconciliation, comfort, and inspiration. The Diaconate consists of nine persons plus those whom the congregation has elected deacon for life.



This Week, we spotlight one of our new deacons, **Dottie Howell**.

Born and raised in the New York City metropolitan area, faith formation was always an important part of her life, having grown up as a Lutheran (ELCA). After graduating from high school, she went to work as a secretary with New York Life Insurance Company, followed by several years of clerical work with Burroughs Welcome Company. Bob and Dottie were high school sweethearts and got married shortly after he completed military service in Korea. Soon after the marriage, Dottie had and raised two daughters, continued working as a part-time secretary, and took college courses as well. Bob and Dottie have been very

active in local churches, including serving together as youth group leaders.

After a nearly 35-year career, Bob responded to a call to full-time Christian ministry that he began to sense as a boy and then was called to pastor a Congregational church in Rossmoor. Together they faithfully served the church, singing in the choir and carrying out pastoral responsibilities. In 2010, they joined Danville Congregational Church. She continues to support Bob's interests in interfaith and social justice ministries. As a member of DCC, she has faithfully supported worship service responsibilities and served on the Sister Parish Committee, having participated in a delegation that visited the San Antonio sister congregation about eight years ago.
