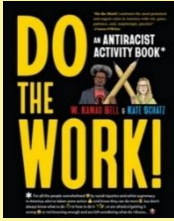

New Weekly Spotlight – Meet Our Deacons This Week – Meet Mary Kay McClure

We are continuing our spotlight of DCC's deacons, aka the Diaconate. This week, we spotlight the final of our new deacons, **Mary Kay McClure**.

Born and raised in Altadena, CA. I was active at 1st Congregational Church in Pasadena in the youth choir, attending camp at Pilgrim Pines and teaching Sunday School. I really enjoyed teaching. I attended UCSB obtaining the very last degree offered in Elementary Education in four years. I married and moved to Annapolis, MD in 1967. I got a job teaching 6th grade right downtown. Maryland had just integrated its schools in 1966. The process of integrating students and teaching staffs in a very large district was fascinating. I joined the Annapolis UCC which had been an Evangelical and Reformed congregation changing to UCC after the merger in 1957. I was in Boston at the time of the merger vote where my grandmother was a delegate. I was the first woman to serve communion at that church, was the "Altar Guild" lady and served on the church council. I was a founding mother of the YWCA's Womans' Center in Annapolis where we served the interests of "misplaced homemakers", victims of rape or domestic violence and advocated for the passage of the ERA. I marched in the ERA parade in D.C. I oversaw volunteers that monitored judges' sentences of convicted domestic assailants for two summers in their courtrooms. We tabulated those sentences which were meager to say the least. Things changed as a result of those findings. I was appointed to the Anne Arundel County Commission for Women; chairing its Education Committee with an emphasis on the passage of Title 9 and overseeing placement of information about its benefit in libraries and voting locations. I came home in 1982 and lived in Benicia because I loved it and it had a UCC. I moved to Walnut Creek 1996 and joined DCC at that time. I have served as Stewardship Chair, on Diaconate and am a Antiracism Team member.
