#### **Condolences to the Prickett family**

DCC member **Mary Ann Prickett** passed away on August 2nd at the age of 91. She worshipped regularly at DCC until her move to a local care facility eight years ago.

A native of Kansas, Mary Ann grew up in a rural area near Chico where her father was a veterinarian. She graduated from Stanford University, where her life-long fandom of collegiate basketball, especially for the Stanford women's team, flourished. She moved to San Francisco where she worked for American Airlines and met her husband, Ward.

Following their move to Connecticut Mary Ann was employed by Pratt Whitney, where she eventually became branch manager of their credit union. In later years Mary Ann and Ward moved to Pacific Grove where she continued her life-long involvement in the life of the church, including serving as moderator of council and a delegate to regional conferences. In 1997 Mary Ann, now widowed, moved to San Ramon to be closer to family.

She is survived by her son Kevin, daughter-in-law Angela, and granddaughters Audrey and Ashley. A graveside service in Kansas was held earlier this month.

## New Weekly Spotlight –Meet Our Deacons This Week – Carol Bassett



DCC's deacons, aka the Diaconate, are appointed by the Church Council "to aid and advise the Minister(s) and the Council, to stand with and listen to persons in the congregation, and to provide special ministries of reconciliation, comfort, and inspiration. The Diaconate consists of nine persons plus those whom the congregation has elected deacon for life. This Week, we spotlight **Carol Bassett.** 

My Husband, John and I joined DCC in early 1991. Not long after, our son Matthew was born. Due to birth complications, he would spend his first

six months of life at Children's Hospital Oakland. I firmly believe that the many prayers from DCC are the reason he was able to come home early in 1992. Matthew and I spent his first year at home in isolation. We were visited by a wonderful Diaconate member, Ilo Maynard. She helped ease a difficult time. In April 2020 my husband passed away. DCC, its pastors and members have been and continue to be my rock. I am so blessed and grateful.

I served on the Diaconate twice before 2024-2025. I began helping set up Communion, even before becoming a member of the Diaconate. During my time as a Deacon, I have served as Clerk, Communion Coordinator and was the back-up for Acts of Kindness. I have served on the Building & Grounds Commission, on and off since 1997, and currently since 2021. I have served on the Worship Commission twice and am currently a member. I have been an Emmaus team Leader since 2021.

Thank you for asking me to be a Deacon. It is an important part of my life and the life of the Church.
