SCRIPTURE LESSON

[Jeremiah 29:1,4-7](#)

These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon.

Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon:

"Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. Find spouses and have sons and daughters; support your sons in finding spouses, and your daughters in caring marriages; celebrate your grandchildren and great-grandchildren; be creative, productive and multiply. Do not decrease or make yourself small. But seek the peace of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare."

Christ put an end to the hostility between us. He came and announced the Good News of 'Peace to you who were far away, and Peace to those who were near'. Indeed, through him, we are brought close in one spirit to our living God. So then, even though Christ's Kingdom is not of this world, you are no longer strangers and aliens to each other, but you are bound together politically as God's holy people --citizens of Christ's city coming through you into this world--and members of God's household.

Children - Join us for Godly Play today

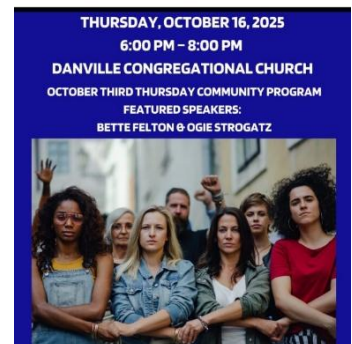

together, plus art and snack!

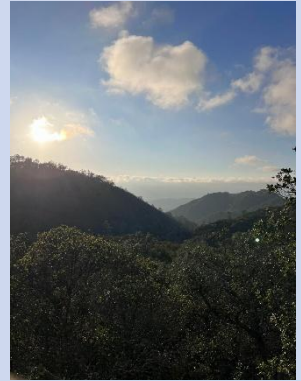
Thursday, October 16th from 6:00pm–8:00pm **Civic Engagement Check-In Event at DCC**
